
A Time To Honor

A Time For Friends



'Judge' Sam Ellison passed sentence on the would-be-club members after hearing the testimonies of such witnesses as Character, Scholarship, Leadership, and Service.





Four of the girls and "Miss" Dee attended the French Club Convention at the University of





LHS also had seven representatives to the All State Chorus in Mobile this year.



Library Staff




Homecoming 1968-69

The entire student body worked together to make this Homecoming a success.




