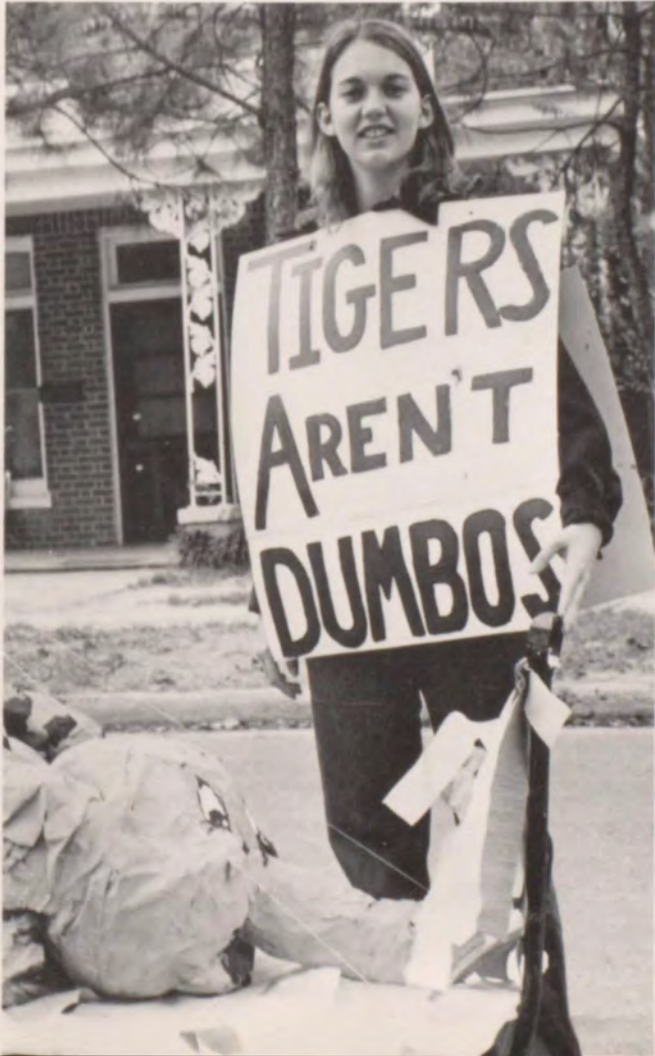




Homecoming Presents Fantasyland

The Tigers' only other scoring threat came in the third quarter when they drove to the Ozark 30. Ozark intercepted a pass to stop the drive, making the final score:

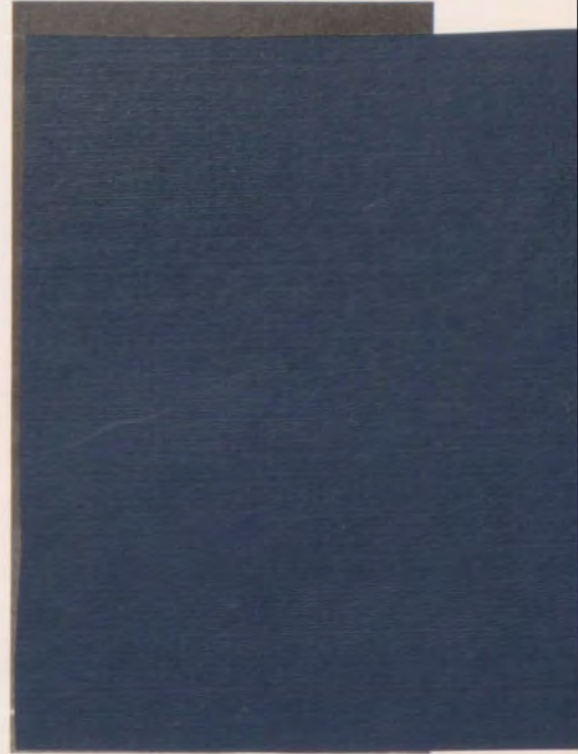

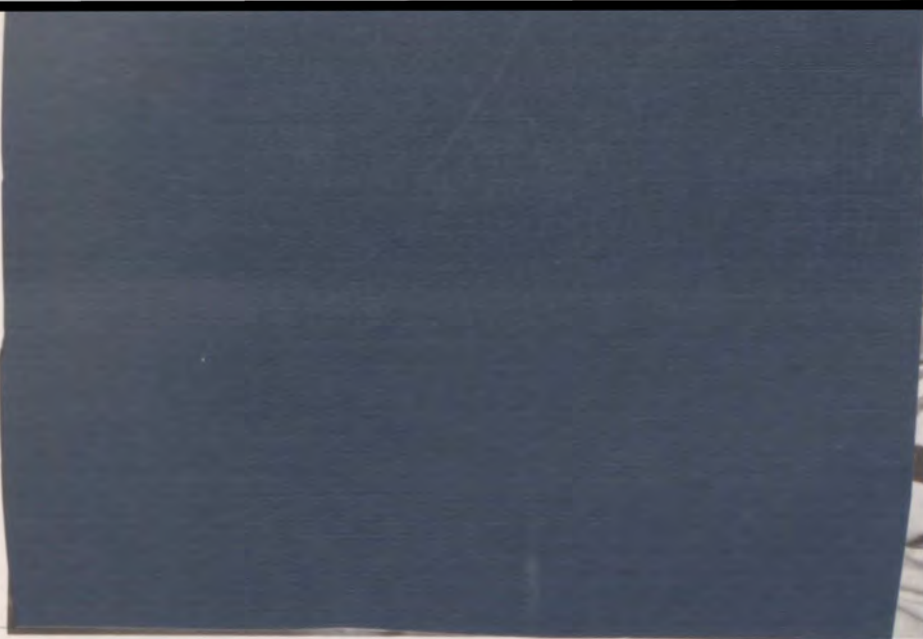
